

## Revelation Chapter 3

As we move from Chapter 2 into Chapter 3 of the Book of Revelation, we must understand that this is not a new beginning, but a continuation of Yeshua's inspection of His house.

The pattern continues. The voice is the same. The urgency only grows.

In Chapter 2, we saw the letters to four assemblies: Ephesos, Smyrna, Pergamos, and Thyatira. Each one was like a spiritual report card; some were praised for their endurance, others corrected for compromise. Yeshua walked among the lampstands, and He did not look at appearance; He examined the heart. He spoke truth, not flattery. He called for repentance, not routine.

Now in Chapter 3, the journey continues, and so does the warning.

The next three assemblies, Sardis, Philadelphia, and Laodicea, show us even more clearly the contrast between outward appearance and inward condition, between true faith and empty form, between the living and the dying.

Sardis opens this chapter, and it does so with a shock:  
“You have a name that you are alive, but you are dead.”

It's a spiritual tragedy, a community known for life, now exposed as a shell. The message that began in Chapter 2, to return, to overcome, to stay awake, is not just repeated in Chapter 3. It becomes louder. More urgent. More personal.

And so we continue, not just reading ancient words, but hearing Yeshua's voice today, calling out to each of us:  
“Wake up. Strengthen what remains. Return to what you first heard.”

We are not reading history; we are being searched.  
Each assembly, each letter, each word is for us now.

And as we continue into this chapter, may we come with ears open, garments clean, and hearts ready, because the King is speaking to His people.
